Robotics Presentation Draws Attention on Children's Day



Children's Day was observed in a bright and engaging manner, and one of the main attractions this year was the Robotics Showcase presented by our students. Parents gathered around the display area as different robots were introduced one by one; the demonstrations were clear and well organised, giving everyone a clear idea of how each robot works and how these tools can strengthen students' practical skills in technology.

The school has initiated a partnership with Prag Robotics, Chennai, to introduce a structured robotics programme for students. The presentation on Children's Day offered the first view of these technologies. The automated ground vehicle displayed obstacle detection and line-following movement, giving children early exposure to basic coding and sensor behaviour.



Much attention was drawn to the humanoid robot, which moved and responded to commands, illustrating how students can explore balance, motion and simple interaction through practical tasks. Parents appreciated the clarity of the presentations and the confidence shown by the children. The event highlighted the growing role of robotics in the curriculum, supporting problem-solving skills, logical thinking and technological awareness. The Children's Day showcase provided a brief glimpse of how these tools will support learning in the coming months.

Scouts and Guides Take Part in Key Activities

Our Scouts and Guides participated in the 9th National Jamboree conducted in Lucknow, a major event in the movement that drew attention across the country. The programme introduced students to national-level activities and helped them understand how large-scale Scouts and Guides programmes are organised. The experience gave them a clearer view of leadership roles, service responsibilities and the wider structure of the movement.

The unit also participated in JOTA-JOTI, the international communication programme of the World Organization of the Scout Movement. Through guided radio and online communication, students interacted with groups from different regions and received certificates from the World Scout Committee for their participation. The programme introduced them to global communication practices and helped them connect with the wider Scouting community.

Alongside this national programme, the unit continued with regular training sessions, drills and group tasks that supported discipline, cooperation and responsibility. Members joined different camps and outdoor activities where they practised basic skills, worked in groups and completed assigned tasks under the guidance of their leaders. These engagements strengthened their confidence and improved their understanding of teamwork.

Students Attended AFS National Conference



Students of Adhiyaman Public School participated in the AFS India Member Schools National Meet held at Bidar, Karnataka. The delegation attended the programme under the guidance of Smt Shobha Thirumal Murugan, Secretary of the Adhiyaman Group of Institutions, and Ms K. Sanjana, Chemistry Teacher. Their direction and support ensured that the students were well prepared for the sessions and activities.

The conference included cultural sessions, guided visits and opportunities for students to meet peers from across the country. Participants observed traditional performances, visited important local sites and joined structured group activities that highlighted cooperation, respect and intercultural learning. These engagements gave students practical experience in community interaction and showed them how ideas and values are exchanged in larger educational gatherings. AFS India, a part of the international AFS Intercultural Programs network, focuses on building global awareness, cultural sensitivity and responsible citizenship among young people. The national conference helped reinforce these aims by offering students meaningful opportunities to communicate, reflect and grow. The programme supported their confidence and prepared them to appreciate diversity and contribute positively in wider learning environments.


Cambridge YLE Exam Conducted on 21 and 22 November

The examination covered listening, speaking, reading and writing through clear, age-appropriate tasks based on everyday English. The programme helps students build stronger communication skills and use the language with confidence. It also gives teachers a clear view of each learner's progress. In Focus: Children's Day

Children's Day



Children's Day was marked with a cheerful set of programmes that included dances, a short drama, songs, speeches and a range of enjoyable competitions. Students from the KG section added colour to the celebration with their performances, which were warmly received by everyone. Their parents also took part in the day's activities and contributed to the enthusiasm on campus.



Experiential Learning Visit for Grade 1



Grade 1 students visited the fire station, the stadium and the spinning mill as part of an experiential learning activity. At the fire station they learnt about the work of firefighters and observed the engines and equipment used during emergencies. The visit to the stadium allowed them to see the sports facilities and spend time in an open environment with their teachers. They also visited the Krishnagiri District Cooperative Spinning Mill, where they saw the basic stages of converting cotton into thread and understood how the machines function. The trip gave the students exposure to community services, physical activity and the early processes of textile manufacturing.

Drama Activity – English Enrichment Programme



The students of Grade 8C took part in a thoughtful drama activity based on the lessons *Ada's Violin* and *One Man, One Movement*. As part of the English enrichment programme, they prepared short scripts inspired by the themes and characters from these texts. In groups, the children shaped dialogues, shared roles, and rehearsed with steady enthusiasm. Their in-class presentations reflected teamwork, expressive acting, and a clear grasp of the values woven into the stories. The activity supported their comprehension, communication, and creative writing while also helping them speak with confidence before their peers. The overall effort and engagement of the class were truly appreciable.

A Practical Glimpse into Parliamentary Process



The students of Grade 6A conducted a clear and well-organised mock parliament session as part of their Social Science activity. The class was divided into ruling and opposition groups, and a student Speaker was chosen to guide the proceedings. Each group prepared simple points for discussion and presented them one by one. Students questioned, responded, and expressed their views just as in a real parliamentary setting.



An Informative Exhibition on Seeds and Food Items

The students of Grade 5E prepared an impressive seed exhibition as part of their classroom learning. Guided by the Tamil Department, the children prepared well-organised display sections using a range of items such as seeds, grains, leafy vegetables, vegetables, and everyday food ingredients. Each group explained the characteristics, sources, and practical uses of the items they presented, helping the class understand their role in daily living and nutrition.

Maths in Daily Life



Grade 3 students visited the vegetable market to observe how addition and subtraction are used in daily life. During the visit, students looked at a variety of vegetables such as tomatoes, carrots, brinjals and potatoes. Teachers guided them in adding prices to find the total cost and subtracting to calculate the remaining amount after a purchase. The activity helped students connect classroom learning to real situations and understand the practical use of basic arithmetic. Though it was a small activity, it gave students a clear real-life experience of how maths is used outside the classroom.

Learn Basics Initiative to Strengthen Mathematics

The *Learn Basics* programme, introduced this year for students of Classes 6 to 8, aims to strengthen foundational understanding in Mathematics through a structured and consistent learning approach. The programme helps teachers identify each student's grasping level and specific learning needs, using level-based workbooks, focused revision tasks, and well-prepared study materials. Weekly tests are conducted on the topics taught, followed by a detailed analysis that guides students on areas requiring improvement. Creative questions, ranging from basic to higher-order thinking, encourage application and independent problem-solving. Star performers are recognised regularly to motivate steady effort. Students have shown keen interest in the programme, and the timely feedback and systematic practice have supported better conceptual clarity and improved mathematical performance.

Students Take Part in Public Speaking Training



A Public Speaking Training session was conducted to help students express their thoughts with clarity and confidence. Through guided practice, they learnt how to structure ideas, use their voice effectively, and face an audience without fear. The activity encouraged active participation, improved communication skills, and helped the learners build a stronger stage presence.

Reflections on National Integration Day



National Integration Day was observed with a simple and meaningful gathering that brought students and teachers together. A short programme was arranged where groups presented songs and brief reflections centred on unity and shared responsibility. The atmosphere encouraged the children to think about how cooperation and respect shape a peaceful nation.

A Glimpse of Our Culture



India is known for its diversity in language, dress, tradition and customs. As part of a cultural activity, the Hindi Department organised a short presentation highlighting this richness. Students dressed in traditional attire from different regions and displayed the variety that marks the country's identity.



The storytelling competition brought the students together for an hour of listening and narration. Each participant stepped forward with a short tale they had prepared, speaking in their own rhythm and style.

A panel of teachers listened to every narration and noted how well the students spoke, how they held the thread of the story and how naturally they connected with the listeners. The children waited for their turn with a mix of eagerness and calm effort, and the room held a sense of simple involvement throughout.

Cybersecurity Awareness Programme



The Department of Computer Science conducted a Digital Awareness Programme in our school to guide students on safe online practices, protection of personal data, and responsible use of digital platforms. The session helped them understand basic cyber safety and the need for careful behaviour in the digital world.

Space Animation Project in the Computing Session

The computing period turned lively as students worked on a Scratch activity that recreated a simple space journey. They followed a guided set of steps to code a rocket that moves from Earth to the Moon, learning how to use broadcast messages, sprite actions and backdrop changes along the way.



The session took an interesting turn when Giga, a small alien sprite, joined the scene. Students added short dialogues and movements for the character, which made their moon-landing sequence more engaging. Each group shaped its own version of the story, giving the activity a creative touch.

The class remained focused as they tested, corrected and improved their animations. Their work showed that coding could be used not just for commands but also to build short stories through movement and interaction. It became a simple demonstration of how imagination and programming can meet on a single screen.

Scout and Guide Activities at a Glance

The Scouts and Guides unit carried out a series of activities that encouraged discipline, teamwork and practical learning. Students took part in drills, simple demonstrations and group tasks that helped them understand the basic principles of scouting.

Fire and Rescue Demonstration



A Fire Safety Awareness Programme was organised in collaboration with Adhiyaman Matric School. Mr Ramamoorthi, Fire Safety Officer from the Uthangarai Fire and Rescue Station, led the session with his team, explaining safety steps and demonstrating basic rescue methods. More than 300 Scouts, Guides, Cubs, and Bulbuls attended the programme, observed the demonstrations, and learnt the essentials of responding to emergency situations.

Our Scouts and Guides Delegation at the 19th National Jamboree, Lucknow



Fourteen Scouts and Guides from our school participated in the 19th National Jamboree at Vrindavan Yojana, Lucknow. The event brought together over thirty thousand cadets from India and nearby countries. Our students visited cultural stalls, joined skill-based activities, explored science and technology pavilions, and interacted with international teams. The camp gave them clear learning in discipline, cooperation, and practical scouting skills, making it a valuable and memorable experience.

This certificate recognises participation in the JOTA-JOTI event held from 17 to 19 October 2025, an international Scouting programme conducted through radio and internet communication. It stands as a record of the school's involvement in this global initiative and reflects the commitment shown during the event.



Mobile Usage Survey by Class 11 Commerce



The Class 11 Commerce students undertook a field project in Kelapparai, a village in Harur taluk, Dharmapuri district. The project began with a house-to-house survey, during which the students collected data on mobile phone usage among school-going children. After completing the household data collection, the team visited the Government School in Kelapparai, where they conducted an awareness session on the safe and responsible use of mobile phones.



The collected data was later organised and presented using various statistical tools, including tables, pie charts, bar diagrams, and histograms. By applying these methods to real-life information, the students gained a clearer understanding of data analysis and interpretation. The field visit provided valuable practical experience and strengthened their ability to connect classroom learning with actual community situations.

Students Develop Water-Tracking Mobile App



The students of Class 7 A developed a mobile application designed to help users monitor their daily water intake. The app allows users to track how much water they drink each day and gives alerts when the intake is lower than the recommended level. Through this project, the students combined creativity with practical thinking and learnt the basics of app development. The initiative shows their interest in using technology to support healthy habits and highlights the growing digital skills among our learners.



Hindi Teachers' Training Programme



On 11.10.2025, the Hindi Department teachers attended a training workshop at Hosur on innovative methods of teaching. The session introduced game-based learning techniques and modern tools such as AI and visual learning platforms. The workshop was engaging and helped the teachers strengthen their skills to meet the needs of present-day students. The training proved to be a refreshing and meaningful experience for the entire Hindi Department.

Faculty Takes Part in New India Education Summit 2025



Teachers attended the New India Education Summit – South India Edition with the support and guidance of Honourable Chairman Sir and Principal Ma'am. The summit included stalls showcasing programmes for cognitive and psychomotor skill development.
